Accepting its first class of 18 students in 1983, the School of Allied Health Sciences offered baccalaureate programs in physical therapy, occupational therapy, and medical technology.

Today the School of Allied Health Sciences is one of the largest HSC schools and serves more than a thousand students in several diverse degree programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels.
